Are virtual follow-ups effective after psychiatric emergencies?

When someone visits the emergency department for a psychiatric emergency, follow-up appointments are an important next step to ensure they receive the care they need to recover. Virtual follow-up appointments, usually in the form of a video call, offer several advantages. For those who find travel difficult or have limited time, a virtual appointment can be much easier. But are virtual appointments as effective as an inperson visit when assessing the wellbeing of someone who has had a mental health emergency? Do patients who attend an in-person follow-up experience better

outcomes?
